Passion (Palm) Sunday April 13, 2025

"I have learned more from the crucifix than from any other book"

St. Thomas Aguinas

Br. Domini Caserta O.P. overheard a voice from the Crucifix speak to St. Thomas "You have written well of me, Thomas. What reward will you receive from me for your labor?" St. Thomas' response was simple: "Domine, non nisi Te." "Lord, nothing except you." Lord, nothing except you.

Holy Week invites us to live this with intensity.

Lord, nothing except you.

We are to live it at the foot of the Cross.

But the Cross is hidden this week in our churches! Why?

In the final words of St. Luke's Passion we find the reason:

"When all who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts." (Lk. 23: 50)

The curious spectators who really had no clue what was happening were overcome with sorrow, how much more must we hang our heads before what has happened. They were looking for momentary distraction by Roman brutality. We look upon what our dear Jesus endures ... because of our brutality.

Yes ... my brutality ... your brutality ... our brutality

Was it not the Jews? Was it not the Romans? St. Robert Bellarmine answers:

Since our sins made the Lord Christ suffer the torment of the cross, those who plunge themselves into disorders and **crimes crucify the Son of God anew in their hearts** (for he is in them) and hold him up to contempt. And it can be seen that our crime in this case is greater in us than in the Jews. As for them, according to the witness of the Apostle, "None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory." We, however, profess to know him. and when we deny him by our deeds, **we in some way seem to lay violent hands on him.** (CCCS 598)

St. Francis of Assisi is much more direct:

Nor did demons crucify him; it is you who have crucified him and crucify him still, when you delight in your vices and sins.

That is what we first learn at the foot of the Cross:

"He was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed."

So we are silent – we beat our breasts – we fast – we pray – we share ... and we listen to a deeper learning from the Cross:

LOVE bade me welcome; yet my soul drew back,
Guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack
From my first entrance in,
Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning
If I lacked anything.

'A guest,' I answered, 'worthy to be here:'
Love said, 'You shall be he.'
'I, the unkind, ungrateful? Ah, my dear,
I cannot look on Thee.'
Love took my hand and smiling did reply,
'Who made the eyes but !?'

'Truth, Lord; but I have marred them: let my shame Go where it doth deserve.' 'And know you not,' says Love, 'Who bore the blame?'

'My dear, then I will serve.'
'You must sit down,' says Love, 'and taste my meat.'
So I did sit and eat.


